Knowledge & The Fear of the Lord

Core Scriptures: Isaiah 11:2d; Psalm 111:10; Proverbs 9:10; Philippians 3:10; Colossians 1:9-10
Big Idea: When God becomes big in my eyes again, my problems lose their right to define me.
Purpose: Help believers anchor their identity in knowing God and recover holy reverence so fear, pressure, and circumstances lose their power to govern perspective.

This Week's Focus

Knowledge and the fear of the Lord anchor the believer in intimacy and reverence. This week is about making God big again in our perspective so our problems lose the power to define us.

Teaching Notes

Knowledge is more than information about God. It is living awareness of who God is through relationship, trust, and experience. The fear of the Lord is not terror that makes me run from God; it is holy reverence that brings me into alignment with God.

An anchor does not remove the storm. It keeps the vessel from being carried away by the storm. Knowledge and reverence anchor my identity, decisions, and perspective.

Reflection Questions

- What has felt bigger than God in my mind lately?
- Do I know about God, or am I growing in knowing God?
- Where has familiarity reduced my reverence?
- How can I practice the fear of the Lord in daily decisions?
- What truth about God's character do I need to hold onto this week?

Practice This Week

Write down one problem that has felt overwhelming. Under it write: God is bigger than this. Then list three truths about God's character that speak to that situation.

Prayer

Holy Spirit, restore the knowledge of God in my life. Teach me to know God beyond information. Bring me into deeper intimacy, greater reverence, and stronger trust. Let the fear of the Lord anchor my identity, my decisions, and my perspective.

Declaration

God is bigger than my problem. God is greater than my fear. God is stronger than my weakness. God is wiser than my confusion. I am anchored in the knowledge of God and the fear of the Lord.
