Counsel & Might

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Core Scriptures: Isaiah 11:2c; 2 Timothy 1:7; Proverbs 19:21; Ephesians 3:16; Joshua 1:9
Big Idea: Counsel shows me the next step. Might gives me the strength to take it.
Purpose: Help believers move from panic to strategy, from emotional fatigue to execution, and from delayed obedience to Spirit-empowered action.

This Week's Focus

Counsel and might move the believer from panic to strategy and from hesitation to Spirit-empowered obedience. This week is about learning how to receive divine direction and the courage to act on what God has said.

Teaching Notes

Counsel gives direction. Might gives strength to obey the direction. Some believers do not lack information; they lack execution. Fear can keep asking for more confirmation when God has already given instruction.

A sound mind does not mean I never feel pressure. It means pressure is no longer the decision-maker. The Holy Spirit becomes the command center of my life.

- What fear has been disguising itself as wisdom?
- What instruction has God already given me?
- What anxiety loop do I need the Spirit to interrupt?
- What is one practical step of obedience I can take this week?
